



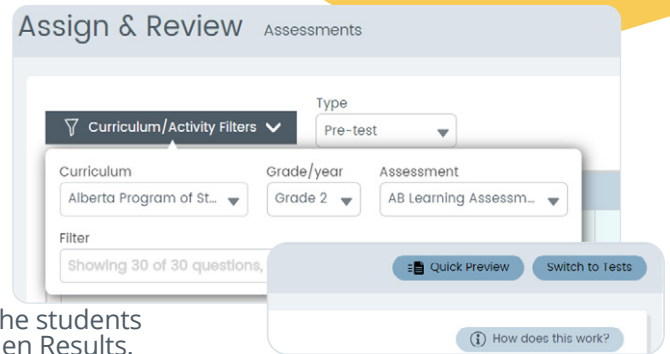




1 Assign an Assessment

- Click Assign & Review 
- Click Assessments 
- Use the filters to find your curriculum OR
- Click Switch to Tests
- Use filters to find your assessment
- Click [Schedule](#)

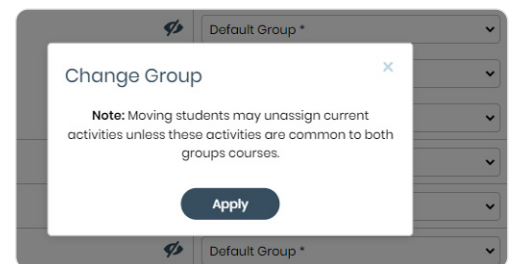
You can preview the assessments before scheduling. Once the students have completed the assessment, click back into tests, and then Results.






2 Create learning groups

- Click Manage Students 
- Click 
- Click 
- Enter name and course level
- Select the group from the drop down across from students' names
- Click 
- Manage

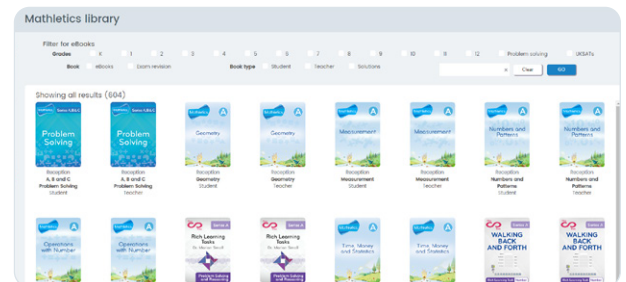
You can move students in and out of groups according to their progress throughout the year.






3 Use the Mathletics Library to print worksheets at any level worksheets

- Click Resource Hub 
- Click Mathletics Library 
- Select a workbook
- Click 

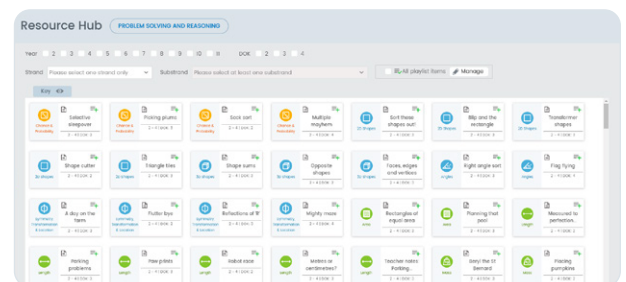
Students don't see the grade/year level of the worksheets.





4 Assign Problem Solving & Reasoning at any grade level and by depth of knowledge

- Click Resource Hub 
- Click Problem Solving & Reasoning 
- Use filters to assign different grades/years and depth of knowledge
- Select PSR activity
- Click 

Click into Assign & Review, then Problem Solving & Reasoning to view your students work and answer any questions they have right online! You can preview each activity prior to assigning.



5 Set minimum levels in Live Mathletics according to students' ability
