


If you're new to Reading Eggs, the first step you'll want to take is to add students and assign them to your class. Please note that your subscription coordinator may have already added students for you.

- Log in to your teacher console.
- In the left navigation, click Management.
- In the drop down, click Manage Students.
- Check to see if students have already been added to your class they'll appear as a list at the bottom of the screen.
- If not, you'll need to add the students to your class.
- There are four ways you can add students:



Editing Students

Once your students are added, they'll be assigned a login ID and password. At any time, you can edit student information. For example, you may want to change their password to something easier for them to remember. Please note, if your students also have Mathseeds, any changes made to their login in Reading Eggs will also change their login in Mathseeds. To edit student information, follow these steps:



Parent Letter

Parents can set up their own Parent Account, which is linked to their child's account. From their account, parents have access to reports, parent guides and printable worksheets. It's a great way to get your parents engaged and supporting their children with Reading Eggs.

Parents can also track their child's progress and encourage extra reading at home. Parent letters provide all the information needed to access Reading Eggs and are pre-populated with each student's login details, making it easier on you!





Placement Test

Now that you've set up your students, it's time to launch Reading Eggs to your class! No matter which program(s) you choose to use with your students, they should first complete a Placement Test to ensure they're starting their journey at the appropriate level.

When a student first starts their Reading Eggs journey, they'll arrive at their 'My Programs' page. From here, they can select the area of the program they're going to use and begin their placement test.



+TEACHING TIP:

Which program should my students use?

- Learning to read using a Systematic Synthetic Phonics approach? Use Fast Phonics
- Learning to read using a blended phonics approach? Use Reading Eggs
- Developing comprehension skills, fluency and vocabulary with independent readers? Use Reading Eggspress

Students can also use more than one area concurrently.

Reading Eggs & Reading Eggpress

If a student chooses to start their Reading Eggs journey, they will be asked to complete a Placement Test or begin their journey on Lesson 1 (no reading skills). In Reading Eggpress, students are required to take a Placement Test before they can begin. In both programs, the student will be placed on the map best suited to their level after answering three questions wrong.





Placement Test

Fast Phonics

The Fast Phonics Placement Test uses advanced technology with sensitive sound recognition to enable the program to pick up on whether a child is saying a word correctly, while still allowing for regional accents and dialects. It will place children in the correct "Peak" (Lesson) on the map based on their phonics knowledge and ability to blend phonemes to accurately read words.




Changing Student(s) Placement & Changing Progress

To change the Lesson a student is placed on, reset or override the Placement Test in any program:

Select Management, then select Manage Progress

Select Save changes to confirm.

- This will list your current students and which level they are currently working on in their student centre.
- Select the **Edit** button to the right of the name of student you wish to edit progress for.
- Update the student detail fields as required. This is where you will be able to reset their placement test or move them to another Lesson.

Note: If using Reading Eggspress Placement Test with students working more than 2 years below their grade level, you will need to manually adjust their placement using 'Manage Progress'.





Lessons

Fast Phonics takes students on an exciting journey, accompanied by a yeti and his fun friends, the furballs. As they learn new phonemes (letter sounds) and words, they progress through each "Peak" (Lesson), earning gems and yet coins to upgrade their yeti's home. Students progress through 20 Lessons, each with 20 activities and up to four decodable books to read.

- Activities with blue gems introduce students to a new word.
- Activities with pink gems introduce students to a new phoneme.
- Activities with green gems, launch a **book** for the student to read.
- Activities without a gem, provide students with a teaching video which will introduce a new phoneme or a new concept such as **digraphs** or **CVC** words.



Fast Phonics is aligned to the phases of Letters and Sounds. Phase 2 is covered in Peaks 1-5, Phase 3 is covered in Peaks 6 -12, Phase 4 is covered in Peaks 13 & 14 and Phase 5 is covered in Peaks 15-20.

Confident students working at Phase 4 and beyond, can extend their practice of blending and segmenting, develop early comprehension skills, and extend their vocabulary by also working in Reading Eggs, with a particular focus on Storylands for early comprehension lessons. Students will need to complete the Placement Test in Reading Eggs and need to be placed beyond lesson 60 for Storylands to open.

+TIP: We've included teaching guides, weekly lesson plans for each Lesson and teaching support videos to make it easier than ever for you to teach phonics! Also included are tons of resources like sound mats, flashcards, worksheets, printable readers and so much more!

Student Engagement & Rewards

Track Progress

At the top of the screen is the Progress Bar which tracks the phonemes learned (pink gems) words read (blue gems) and books read (green gems). The Progress Bar also shows students percentages for each end of Peak Quiz and certificates earned.



Certificates

Students earn a certificate when they pass their end of Peak quiz (over 80%). Certificates earned will show up in their progress bar. To access printable certificates, go to **Quick Links** in the left hand navigation of your teacher console, select **Fast Phonics**, then select **Certificates**.

Personalised certificates can be printed out from the My Progress are in the Student Console.



Yeti Coins & Yeti Shop

Yeti Coins are the currency in Fast Phonics and are earned as students progress through their Lessons. Students can use their Yeti Coins to purchase a new Yeti by clicking on the Yeti Coins in their progress bar.





Launching Reading Eggs

This section will walk you through the student view and covers the key areas of the program including what each area is used for and how it can be used to enrich learning and get the most out of Reading Eggs.

Lessons

Reading Eggs contains 120 individual lessons. Once the child has completed their placement test, they will be taken to a map where their lesson begins. Each map contains 10 Lessons and ends with a quiz. Lessons are structured as follows:

Lesson Introduction

Each lesson begins with an interactive animation where a new concept is modelled in way that is entertaining and educational before jumping into the activities.

Activities

Students will be taken through a series of activities where content is presented in different ways so that children learn to use and apply each new skill in a variety of situations with a blended phonics approach.

• eBook

Each lesson ends with an eBook to reinforce the concept learned in the lesson and is an entertaining way to ensure the children understand what was covered in the Lesson. eBooks can be read independently or children can listen to the narration as they read along.

Critter Hatches

Children are rewarded for their efforts with a critter that hatches from an egg and becomes part of their online collection. Each critter is unique and children will love watching the funny animation that introduces their new critter.

Launching Reading Eggs

Reward

Children are rewarded with golden eggs on completion of every lesson and activity.

These golden eggs are added to their eggy bank and can be spent on items for their house or personal avatar by visiting the Plaza.

At the end of each map (10 lessons), children complete a quiz to assess what they have learned. If they pass, they are rewarded with a certificate and can move onto the next Map. We will cover rewards more on page 16.



Storylands

Storylands works similar to Lessons but with an emphasis on developing early reading comprehension while continuing to build upon reading and vocabulary skills. Students work through a series of 4 maps comprised of 5 Lessons each (140 activities total) in the land of Clinker Castle. Each Lesson ends with a story followed by a comprehension quiz. Storylands will open once the student has completed core Lesson 60. Storylands prepares students for Reading Eggpress, which focuses mainly on developing comprehension skills.

Spelling

The Spelling bank also works as a series of Lessons where children must crack through various vaults to progress their spelling skills to the next level. Each vault level is comprised of 8 Lessons and ends with a quiz. Students work to beat their best score and improve their overall average on the leaderboard. This section will open up once the student has completed core Lesson 40.

Driving Tests

Driving Tests are a fun and engaging way for students to challenge themselves and get some extra practice. There are three test categories with 20 questions each: sight words, letters & sounds and content words. Once students get all 20 questions correct, they are rewarded with a 60 second racing game. Driving tests will open once the student has completed core Lesson 40.

For the educator, Driving Tests are a great way to differentiate learning in the classroom by assigning different tests to different students. They provide a clear picture of where individual students are at in their learning cycle. Within each domain, the tests progress through a continuum of standards-based grade-level skills.



My Program

This section provides an overview of what the student should be working on in the current week. The current Reading Lesson, Spelling Lesson and Driving Test can all be accessed from here.

Additionally, the program will automatically add four books (two fiction, two non-fiction) for the student to read based on where they're at in the program, ensuring students are practicing reading for fun and at the appropriate level. This not only saves time for the teacher but also saves the children from going to the Library where the choice can be overwhelming for early learners.





Reading Eggs motivates & engages students using a range of intrinsic and extrinsic rewards through game pedagogy. These areas can be found on the second row of the student console. The student console map details each of these sections on page 18.

Reading



Golden Eggs

Golden eggs are the Reading Eggs currency and are earned as students progress through their Lessons. Students can use their golden eggs in their eggy bank to buy items for their avatar or their house at the shops in the Plaza.

How to earn eggs

- Lessons: Between 14-32 eggs per complete lesson
- Skills (Spelling) Bank: 18-20 eggs per lesson
- Story factory: 40 eggs per completed book
- Puzzle park: 4 eggs per correct answer
- Driving test: 1 egg for each star collected

Avatar

Students can personalise their avatar by clicking on their avatar in the student console. This is a great place to get students started and excited about beginning the program. Later, once they've earned enough golden eggs, they can come back and add accessories they've purchased at the costume shop in the Plaza.

House

Each student has their very own house to decorate with items purchased at the furniture shop in the Plaza. Children take great pride in their homes and what they've been able to purchase.









Student Engagement & Rewards

Plaza

The Plaza is home to Fig Tree Furniture shop and the Costume Shop. Children love customising their house and avatar and being able to show their friends and parents. They're motivated to earn more eggs (by completing lessons) or save up so they can purchase big ticket items, like a hot tub!

Every month there is a new Monthly Special selection of items to buy for their house or their avatar - special limited editions, encouraging students to earn more eggs every month.



Certificates

Certificates are earned in the quiz at the end of each map. Each quiz has 15 questions. Earning certificates takes time and requires a lot of hard work which should be should be celebrated.


How to earn certificates


- Gold: answer 14 questions correctly
- Silver: answer 12 questions correctly
- Bronze: answer 11 questions correctly

Print off certificates to pin up in the classroom, send home or hand out during school events. Students can return to previously completed end of map quizzes and redo them, aiming for a higher score and a new certificate.

Certificates are displayed in the **Awards** section in the student console and on the awards shelf in each student's house.

Launching Reading Eggspress

Reading Eggspress is geared towards students who have mastered basic reading skills and are ready to continue their literacy journey into reading comprehension, developing fluency and reading for fun. We'll take you through the student view and key areas of the program. The structure is very similar to Reading Eggs but has a more mature theme to appeal to older children.

Encourage your students to explore the program independently by sending them to the Targets section in the student console. Early targets introduce the many features of the program.

Lessons

Reading Eggspress contains 220 individual lessons. Once the child has completed their placement test, they will be taken to a map where their lesson begins. Each map contains 5 Lessons and ends with a quiz. Lessons are structured as follows:

Lesson Introduction


Each lesson has a comprehension strategy focus and begins with an interactive animation of students discussing a new concept before jumping into the activities.

Activities

Activities put the concept into practice. There are many consistent activity types across each lesson. Some of these include:

- **Cover Story:** students make predictions on what a story is about based on its cover
- Dictionary: students choose a dictionary word to study
- Words in context: the chosen dictionary word is studied in context
- **Compare & contrast:** students read a paragraph a must identify what is the same & what is different
- It's not there: students identify words with objects in a picture and must find the missing object
- Keywords: students identify the word with it's meaning
- **Reading:** students read a short passage then answer 10 multiple choice questions to test various literacy concepts & their own knowledge of the subject
- Who, what, where, when: students must find the facts
- Main idea & details: students must identify the main idea & supporting details from a paragraph.







• Quiz

Students read a short passage of text and then complete a quiz based on the text. Successful completion of the quiz with a score of 80%+ is rewarded with a collect-able Trading Card.






Map Chapter Book

Each Lesson ends with a chapter from a book related to the theme on the Map. Reading the chapter and completing the short quiz unlocks special interactive features on the map.

Assessments

Once students have completed all Lessons on the Map, they must complete a final assessment before they can move on to the next Map. In the assessment, students are presented with a piece of writing and must answer a series of 10 multiple choice questions to test their comprehension. Students must score at least 8/10 before they can move on to the next Map.

Assessments (and all activities in Lessons) can be repeated to improve their score.





Launching Reading Eggspress

English Skills (Spelling)

The English skills section contains 216 engaging spelling lessons students will love. It contains a combination of videos, interactive activities and rewardbased games. Each Lesson contains an introduction video, 20 activity questions, a test and feedback on words spelled incorrectly. Students must then practice the words spelled incorrectly before they can progress to the next Lesson.

There are also 432 printable worksheets for off-line learning or paper-based homework assignments.

Stadium

The Stadium is a play area where students can compete against their class, their school, the computer or students across the world in 4 areas:

- Spelling
- Grammar
- Vocabulary
- Usage

Students can check the Leaderboard to see how their peers are scoring and engage in some friendly competition. They can also check their own stats and try beating their highest score.

Reading

Student Engagement & Rewards

Reading Eggspress has been developed with many intrinsic motivators. Students at this age and reading level still enjoy purchasing items for their avatar and apartment but are also increasingly motivated by reward, recognition, competition and achievement.

Golden Eggs

Golden eggs are the Reading Eggspress currency and are earned as students progress through their Lessons and read books in the Library. Students can use their golden eggs in their eggy bank to purchase items at the Mall or play games in the Arcade.

How to earn eggs

- Lessons: 10 eggs per activity
- Library: Each book states how many eggs can be earned once students have read the book and completed the quiz with a minimum of 80% correct answers



Trading cards

Students earn trading cards when they complete a quiz. Trading cards can also be purchased at the Mall or swapped with other students to build their collections. Students enjoy building their collection in each of the six trading card categories. They can view their trading cards in their apartment.

Medals, Medallions & Trophies

These are awarded at the end of a Lesson quiz and are based on eggs earned in a week and build upon as more medals are earned. This encourages students to stay active in the program each week by completing their Lessons and reading Library books.

How to earn

- Gold trophy: 3 silver medallions
- Silver medallion: 5 bronze medals
- Bronze medal: 1,000 eggs (a week)

These awards are displayed in the **Trophy Room** accessed through the student console or through the student's apartment. They require a lot of effort from the student to earn and should be celebrated. Certificates showing the type of medal earned can be printed off to hand out in classrooms, send home or hand out during school events.









Student Engagement & Rewards

My Progress

Students can track their own progression, scores and achievements. They can see overall what Lessons they've completed, average scores within the core and spelling Lessons, targets hit, trophies earned, trading cards collected, reading level and reading growth. They can drill down further to see results from individual Lessons and quizzes. They can also track how many more eggs they need to earn in the week to be rewarded with a Trophy.





Journal

The Reading Journal celebrates reading milestones and rewards students for the number of days they've been readers, either by reading a chapter or a complete book. When the student reaches a milestone, they receive a virtual sticker pack, a certificate, and a motivational reading poster. Students reach milestones when they read for 5, 10, 15, 20, 25, 30, 40, 50, 60, 70, 80, 90, 100, 125, 150, 200, 250, 300, and 350 days. Your students' Reading Journal is automatically updated with books read and they can even choose their cover and themes each month!


Mall, Apartment & Avatar

Students enjoy personalising their avatar with different looks and accessories. Each student also has their very own apartment which they can decorate or even work to upgrade the view from their balcony.

Items for their avatar and apartment can be purchased at the Mall with golden eggs earned in the Lessons. They can also purchase trading cards to add to their collection or pets to keep at their apartment.



Teacher Library

The Library is home to over 3,500 books of varied reading levels matched to your local curriculum. To access the Library, simply click on **Teacher Library** in the left hand navigation.

Find a Book

Search & filter by genre, topic, reading level, fiction/ nonfiction and more to easily find what you're looking for. You can read books directly from your Teacher Library to preview before you assign or share on the whiteboard and read together with your class.

My Collections

Create custom book collections for individual or student groups and share the collections with your students. Shared collections will appear in the Student Library as a collection from their teacher. Research shows that giving children choice over the books they read helps them to develop a habit of reading for pleasure. This feature is great for classroom topic work, guided reading or book clubs.







Student Library

Students can access the Library through the Reading Eggspress student console or through the 'My Programs' page. Library books can either be assigned or shared with students/ groups of students as a collection.

- Shared collections will appear on the Library desk and are optional reading.
- Assigned books will appear as a pop-up when the student logs into Reading Eggspress. Assigned books must be read before the student can use other areas of the program.

Creating and managing assignments is covered on page 29.



Students can browse all 3,500 library titles by topic, add books to their own personal library shelf to read later, and even book mark the page they've left on to come back later.

Assignments

Creating and managing assignments works the same in both Reading Eggs and Reading Eggpress.

Create Assignments

Teachers can create assignments for individuals, groups or the whole class within a specified time frame - and then see progress as students complete the activities. Students are locked into the activity until they have completed it, or the teacher expires the task.

Step 1: Select Students

- Use the check boxes to select individual student(s) or Select all for a group assignment.
- You can also use the drop downs to filter students by class and year.

Step 2: Set time frame

- Select which day you'd like students to receive the assignment and set the due date.
- · After setting the start date, you can set the duration and the due date will automatically populate.

Step 3: Choose an activity






