Create an ABC Reading Eggs Lesson








Constructing a lesson for your students using Reading Eggs is simple! The following example will focus solely on Lesson 50: Phonic Letters and Sounds "ing", but you can follow the same format for any lesson you wish.



Start your class by having your students login to Reading Eggs and complete the Activities within Lesson 50.



Once your students have worked their way through the Activities they will be prompted to put their knowledge gained into practice by reading the matching book. In this example the book is called The King can sing. Students can then find this book in the Reading Eggspress Library and complete the quiz.





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Students can then consolidate their understanding by focusing on the printable worksheets that are available with every Lesson. There's nothing like getting pen to paper! Teachers can find these worksheets in the Teacher Console under Preview Lessons.



Extension Activity

For those who want to go the extra mile, play Hopscotch Words.

Draw a simple hopscotch grid in chalk on the ground (or on card taped to the ground). Write a sound in each grid.

The children must take it in turns to throw a beanbag onto the first square. They must then try to say a word that contains the sound –ig. If correct, they can then continue to hop up and down the hopscotch grid until they reach the beanbag. They must pick this up without standing in the square, and pass it to the next player. After everyone has had a turn, the first player must then throw the beanbag to the second square and try to say a word that contains the sound –id. The entire activity is repeated until every child has thrown the beanbag onto each square and attempted to say a word that belongs to that particular word family.
